

We will focus on St. George's Glenn Dale. Barbara is in discussion with the Sr. Warden and Vestry of St. George's re: adding a second signed service. We are hoping to arrange for signed services on the first and third Sunday of the month. We would like to change the time of these services from 1:30 to 2:00 PM.

The St. Barnabas' Mission Committee has voted to give a \$200 donation to the fund to assist the the family of **Kelby Nathan Brick and Jeanette Pereira**, whose home in Greenbelt was destroyed by fire on September 1.

At 3:30 PM on Sept. 19, **Barbara Allen** went to the National Cathedral's Holy Eucharist in celebration of the opening of the Smithsonian's Museum of the American Indian. She interpreted for St. Barnabas' regular **Jenn Phillips** and **the Rev. Dcn. Betsy Bagione**, who is the Asst. Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Arlington, VA. On the evening of Sept 21, the Rev. Barbara Allen and Ed Knight met with A. Phil Aiello, Chief Technical Officer for FCS Associates. Phil is well known in the Deaf Community and was recommended to us by the Rev. Roger Pickering.

There is only one phone line into St. Barnabas' office. This means that the fax, computer, voice phone and TTY are all on the same line. So, for example, when the TTY is on Auto-Answer we cannot receive a fax and if a hearing person calls they get the TTY answering machine. As things are now we cannot have a voice mail service or an answering machine connected to the voice phone. Consequently, we often miss important TTY and voice calls as well as faxes.

The purpose for Phil's visit with us was to evaluate our set-up and offer possible solutions. Phil is working up a plan and a cost estimate for remedying the problem. He will be in touch with Barbara as soon as he has all the information. When all the information is in Barbara will bring it to the Mission Committee for a vote.

Phil is also researching the possibility of St. Barnabas' sharing St. John's DSL line. He will bring a report on feasibility and cost which will be taken to the Mission Committee.

On October 5, **Mae Lynn Mullen** will start attending class at the Work and Technology Center in Baltimore, in "Deaf Pre-employment Office Technology / Word Processing". It will last six to eight months. She will live in a dorm Monday through Friday and on weekends will live in Silver Spring. Mae Lynn needs to find storage space for her bed, bookcase, and mini-refrigerator. Please pray for Mae Lynn's success in a job search. Mae Lynn knows a number of deaf people who work at NIH and would like to work there.

Cathedral Open House Report by Ed Knight



After doing my internship and spending time with my family, it was almost impossible for me to return to Washington, DC due to the fact that I had trouble getting with a French transit visa. Thanks God! He was at my side.

And I was very happy to be able to make it to come back here in the United Sates. For this, I thank you for your prayers and your support.
