# ELIZABETH A. BAGIONI TO BE ORDAINED IN APRIL

Betsy's Ordination will be on April 14, 2005 At 7:30 PM Trinity Episcopal Church 2217 Columbia Pike Arlington, VA 22204 **Elizabeth A. Bagioni** will be ordained an Episcopal Priest in Arlington in April. She attended Virginia Theological Seminary and graduated in May of 2004. She was ordained a deacon in June 2004 and became the Assistant Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Arlington. She is full-time at Trinity, focusing on community building and apartment ministry, and serves as a chaplain for the local police force. She was born hearing but beginning at age 5, her hearing gradually decreased and she became profoundly deaf by age 18. She had grown up oral and never learned to sign. At age 20, she chose to have a cochlear implant so she could continue working with law enforcement officers. While at VTS, a friend introduced her to Deaf church and she began to meet life-style deaf persons. She has recently begun an ASL course at Gallaudet. She will be ordained a priest on April 14, 2005 at 7:30 PM in Trinity Episcopal Church in Arlington, VA. At her ordination Betsy will have sign interpreters. She invites members and friends of St. Barnabas' to attend and help her celebrate this milestone.

# MARCH 6 SERMON NOTES: SHEEP AND SHEPHERDS

"IN ANCIENT ISRAEL, PEOPLE REFERRED TO THE KING AS A SHEPHERD" On March 6, Pastor Barbara gave a sermon on the 23rd Psalm.

In ancient Israel, the term shepherd could also refer to the king thus the people of the realm could be seen as sheep.

There were good shepherds and bad shepherds (good kings and bad kings). Some kings were better than others in seeing to it that the people had their basic needs met.

The 23rd Psalm applies the image of shepherd to the ultimate king, God, and praises God as the shepherd who is always good and who sees that his people (sheep) are cared for in every way. The "shadow of the valley of death" doesn't have to be translated to refer only to death; it can also refer to adversity or feelings of emptiness and sadness.

Problems are a part of life. But in the midst of our problems we can have faith that our Good Shepherd loves us and cares about us.



#### MARCH 13 SERMON NOTES: RESURRECTION

On March 13, Mother Barbara gave a sermon on the gospel reading that described when Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. The story is not about Lazarus dying spiritually -- Lazarus died physically and Jesus resurrected him to life. However, sometimes people do die spiritually and need to be resurrected spiritually. Barbara recounted how when she was so sick in March she discovered that both her body and her mind would not function. Sometimes when we are sick in body, mind or spirit we feel like we will never recover. On Easter Sunday we will celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, but it can also be a spiritual resurrection for us. 
## More News from Among US

Michael Martin shared with the congregation some information his Deaf Reach counselor had told him. She said he is very lucky to live in Otto Berg Apartments since Section 8 housing is difficult to find nowadays because of budget cuts. Michael says his counselor told him that the government is cutting funding for housing perhaps due to the cost of the war in Iraq. Michael is concerned that he will lose his housing in the future so he asks for our prayers. (The Otto Berg Apartments were of course named after the late Rev. Otto Berg, a former rector of St. Barnabas.)

When **Mark Kleberg** introduced himself to **Ramona Kunkel** we long-term members also learned something new about him. Did you know that his real last name is **Von Kleberg**?



## 2004 TREASURER REPORT: REVENUE

From where did the money come?

In 2004, the total revenue of \$41,947 to fund the programs, missions and functions of St. Barnabas' came from:

70 % from pledges from current parishioners

21 % from other giving by parishioners, friends and visi-

#### tors

9 % from the Diocese specifically for expenses of hosting the 2004 ECD convention

This does not include the Diocesan support that includes our Vicar's compensation package, compensation for our Consultant for Deaf Ministry, interpreter services, or half the pay of our part-time parish assistant. As Treasurer of St. Barnabas', I am very grateful to the Diocese for paying these expenses as I am also grateful to our stewardship-minded members. The number of members pledging has gone up for the 3rd year in a row. (I am also grateful that the Diocese administers the payroll taxes – it greatly simplifies the job of being treasurer.)

## 2004 TREASURER REPORT: EXPENSES

Where did the money go? In 2004, expenses totaled \$29,559.52

30 % for Publicity and Hospitality (ECD Convention expenses, Verizon book ad, new flyers, refreshments, web page, outreach/charity)

21% for Admin and Finance such as the Messenger newsletter, annual audit, office equipment (a laptop for the Vicar), pledge envelopes

18% for Diocese (assessment) and National (UTO, Little Red Church, etc)

13% for maintenance and operation (rent to St. John's, insurance)

10% for Gallaudet Campus ministry

4% for Altar supplies, flowers, Sunday bulletin covers and inserts, vestments

3% for clergy utilities and expenses (pager, phone)

1% for Christian Education program supplies



Note: the senior warden, the junior warden and two members-at-large are elected during odd-numbered years and the secretary and treasurer and the other two members-at-large are elected during even-numbered years. 
